

#GRSummerProject Launched to Connect City Youth to Opportunities for Solving Real Problems in the Community

Participating Students Pledge to Identify Problem, Work in Teams to Find Solutions

GRAND RAPIDS - A local radio group is teaming up with local organizations and businesses to provide Grand Rapids students with funding, resources and mentors to "implement the change they want to see in their community."

The #GRSummerProject will be open to area students in the 6th grade to college freshmen age group. It is a collaboration led by Townsquare Media, includes the support of Level One Bank, Start Garden, Experience GR, Amplify GR and Grand Rapids Schools.

Participating students will be required to sign a "pledge" to be actively involved in collaborating with other participants to identify problems in their neighborhoods they would like to help solve, then working in teams throughout the summer with assigned coaches, find real solutions to these problems. Teams will receive \$1,049.00 to use on their efforts to address and solve their adopted problem/issue and will share their progress via blogs, video and updates through radio and social media, with the help of Townsquare Media's urban contemporary station, Magic 104.9.

"These youth will be challenged to spend June 12th thru August 3rd impacting the change they want to see in their neighborhoods and community," said Stephanie Gonda, general sales manager of Townsquare Media. "With so many negative things happening in communities all over the country, including here in our own city, we wanted to create a summer initiative that would empower our kids to take action for positive changes they wanted to see."

According to Gonda, by engaging businesses and community organizations as financial partners and mentors/coaches in this initiative, it will allow us to "give our community and business professionals a fresh perspective from our the students involved, and in doing so encourage us all to maybe think a little differently...everyone wins."

Teams will provide bi-weekly updates on their respective projects. An end of summer concert featuring a national artist will bring all the teams together for a celebration and to share their accomplishments with the entire community. An August date is being planned.

#GRSummerProject is also giving musicians sixth grade through college freshmen the opportunity to create their original music for a chance at a \$2,500 cash award and the opportunity to perform at the end of summer celebration. The winning musician(s) will also be featured on Magic 104.9 radio.
